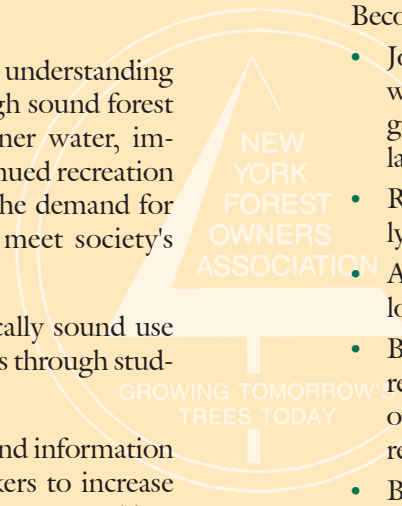
NYFOA Supports economically sound use of privately owned forest lands through studies and education;
