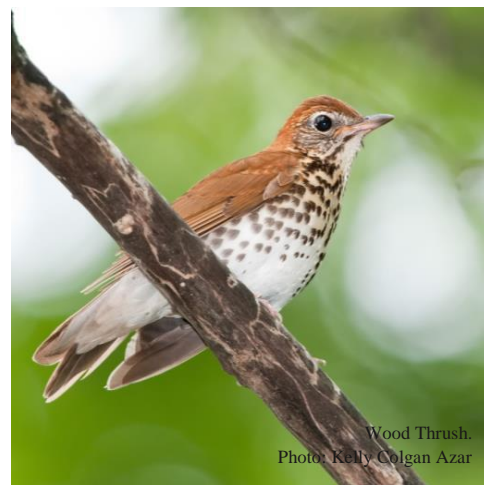


Woods Wildlife and Warblers

Project Overview

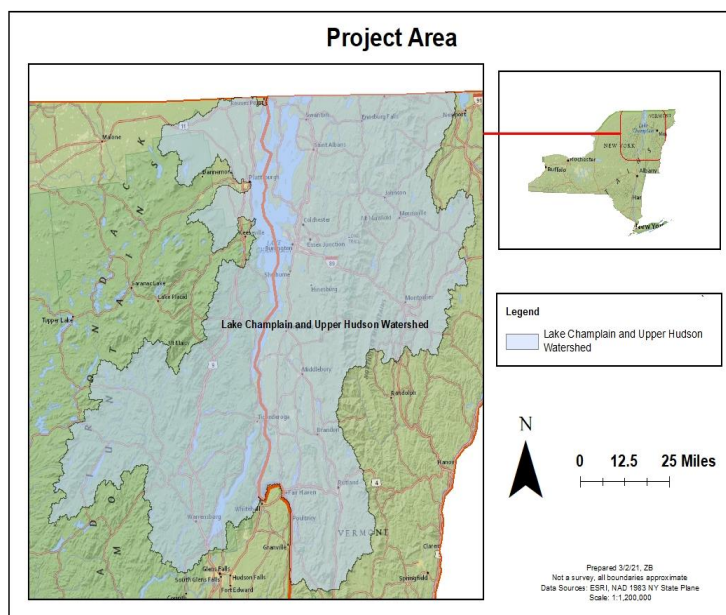
Woods Wildlife and Warblers (WWW) is a collaborative effort among partners to promote management of public and private forests in the Lake Champlain and Upper Hudson Watersheds located in Vermont and New York.

Forests in Vermont and New York are home to some of the highest concentration of breeding bird species in the continental United States, meaning even small landowners are strong allies in conservation. As population trends for many of these forest birds decline due to loss of habitat, among other factors, the future of these forests and the benefits they provide lie in how they are managed.

In our management, we look to increase forest diversity and health to improve habitat for multiple bird species. Target species include American Woodcock, Golden-winged Warbler, Black-throated Blue Warbler, Canada Warbler, and Wood Thrush, among other associated species.

We offer **free, no obligation** services, such as informational materials and site visits from staff members. Staff members will walk your property with you and discuss goals you might have including, but not limited to, enhancing the variety of wildlife, identifying and controlling invasives and planning future forest composition.

WWW is currently seeking landowners that may be interested in creating quality bird habitat on their property.
