WOODSWALK PLANNED FOR May 10th – "A REGENERATION LABORATORY"

In support of NYFOA's "Restore New York Woodlands" initiative, Chapters will continue to host at least one public woodswalk each year with a focus on the forest regeneration crisis. This year's RNYW woodswalk will be at Jerry Michael's tree farm in Whitney Point, where regeneration has been the primary management objective for more than 10 years.

Participants will observe where an early- succession forest has developed in the wake of a 2003 ice storm that leveled the original ten-acre red pine plantation. Natural regeneration has been supplemented by oak, maple and cherry seedlings planted and protected by either plastic tube shelters or deer exclosure fencing.

In an established mature hardwood stand, we will see where desirable natural regeneration has flourished after interfering vegetation was controlled with herbicides, the canopy was opened up, and small deer exclosure fences were erected. Participants will be able to compare the results of management on this property as contrasted to an adjoining property still dominated by large "weeviled" white pine, soft maple culls and diseased American beech. The woodswalk location is 3192 State Route 206, which is 1.3 miles East of Whitney Point, on the top of the hill and on the right (South) side of the road. Parking will be on the shoulder of the highway. Carpool if possible and look for signs. Whitney Point is Exit #8 from I 81.

The woodswalk will start at 9:30 and finish by 11:30. We will walk about a mile on both level and sloping terrain with some wet spots. Please call (607) 648-2941 to sign up so that we can arrange for additional parking if required.

MUSHROOM FORAY/WOODSWALK, JULY 26, 2014, 9:30

When mushrooms enthusiasts say "foray," they're talking about organizing a group of people to go into the forest to look for fungi. Myron Swartz, who is a member of the Susquehanna Valley Mycological Society, will lead us in the hunt for edible mushrooms in a red oak forest owned by Steve Kutney. Harvesting mushrooms is a great way for landowners to take advantage of the bounty of their woods. Myron will show us mushroom varieties that can be clearly identified and taste great.

This red oak forest will be ready for its second harvest in a few years. This stand of red oak has had four timber stand improvement projects. The first was started about 1968 the last about 1993. We will examine oak regeneration and some invasive beech treatment which will hopefully be completed by July.

The property is located at 460 Hunt Hill Road, Port Crane, NY 13833.. If you're going north east from Binghamton on I88 take the Sanitaria Springs exit. Go left from the exit ramp and under I88. Turn right on Hunt Hill Road at the "T" in the road. Continue on Hunt Hill road for about 2.1 miles. The property is located on your right as you pass the top of the hill. Look for the NYFOA sign. Turn into the woods road with your SUV or truck just after you pass a field on your right. If you have a car, it would be best if you parked on Hunt Hill Road. The walk up the woods road is short. If you see a sign that says Vincent Hill Road then you have gone too far on Hunt Hill.

Message from the Chapter Chair
